Pastoral Care and Guests at the Lord's Supper

We are concerned about the spiritual welfare of all who partake of the Lord's Supper. If anyone eats and drinks our Lord's Body and Blood unworthily (that is, not believing what this meal is and the benefits it gives), they eat and drink to their great spiritual harm. Therefore, we kindly ask that any who are not yet instructed, are in doubt, or who hold to a belief different from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LC-MS) would not commune today.

Those who confess oneness in doctrine with us and are members of this congregation or a sister congregation of the LC-MS are welcome to commune. If you are communing, an usher will invite you from your pew to approach the rail. Pastor will then welcome you to the Lord's Table and you can either kneel or continue standing. You will be offered a cup that holds the Body of Christ. Take the cup and consume the Lord's Body. An elder will follow to pour the Lord's Blood into that same cup. If you are not communing but would like to receive a blessing, please come forward and cross your arms at the rail. If you have any questions, please speak with Pastor or an elder before the service. Thank you!

Sermon Summary

Downward mobility isn't the goal of many! Upward mobility?!? Now we're talking! Power! Prestige! Possessions! That's what life is about, right? That's what seems most important to so many! Upward mobility, though, leaves a trail of blood! Adds to the misery and mayhem! What hostility against humanity as folks seek to fill the belly leaving so many stomachs empty!

Jesus shows us a better way with His Palm Sunday parade! It's all about downward mobility of humility for Jesus! No race to the top but a race to the bottom! Rock bottom! There, on the Cross, Jesus bears the burden of our humanity and empties Himself so that He can fill the emptiness in this World!

There's no reason for us to seek to fill ourselves when He's filled us and keeps filling us! "Take, eat!" "Take, drink!" As we feast on His Body and Blood, we're filled to overflowing so that we can go the Jesus way of humility that's all about the downward mobility! Yes, let's stoop and stand in solidarity with the weak, the vulnerable, the suffering! Downward mobility doesn't mean scarcity, but more than enough for everybody! When Jesus emptied Himself, He gave more than we could ever imagine, deserve, or hope for!

Palm Sunday Procession

Palm Sunday is here, which is hard to believe! At the beginning of the service the congregation sings "All Glory, Laud, and Honor" while Pastor and the children will process around the sanctuary with palm branches. 
Epistle Philippians 2:5–11

Holy Gospel Matthew 21:1–11

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the twenty-first chapter.



Now when they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go into the village in front of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will send them at once." This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet, saying,

"Say to the daughter of Zion,

'Behold, your king is coming to you,
humble, and mounted on a donkey,
and on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden."

The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them. They brought the donkey and the colt and put on them their cloaks, and he sat on them. Most of the crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. And the crowds that went before him and that followed him were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" And when he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred up, saying, "Who is this?" And the crowds said, "This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth of Galilee."
