Pastoral Care and Guests at the Lord's Supper

We are concerned about the spiritual welfare of all who partake of the Lord's Supper. If anyone eats and drinks our Lord's Body and Blood unworthily (that is, not believing what this meal is and the benefits it gives), they eat and drink to their great spiritual harm. Therefore, we kindly ask that any who are not yet instructed, are in doubt, or who hold to a belief different from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LC-MS) would not commune today.

Those who confess oneness in doctrine with us and are members of this congregation or a sister congregation of the LC-MS are welcome to commune. If you are communing, an usher will invite you from your pew to approach the rail. Pastor will then welcome you to the Lord's Table and you can either kneel or continue standing. You will be offered a cup that holds the Body of Christ. Take the cup and consume the Lord's Body. An elder will follow to pour the Lord's Blood into that same cup. If you are not communing but would like to receive a blessing, please come forward and cross your arms at the rail. If you have any questions, please speak with Pastor or an elder before the service. Thank you!

Sermon Summary

No alleluias! No trumpet blast! No family photos! No Easter lilies! No chocolate bunnies and candy wrapped in pink, green, and yellow! None of that the first Easter! In Mark's account of Easter morning, the Spice Girls go to the tomb with heads hanging low! The past confusing! The present full of bewilderment! The future dark and dreary! It's a lot of bad news! No one comes back from crucifixion, after all! They expect a limp, lifeless body to anoint in one, final act of love and respect for this man that healed, taught, doing only good! What they experience, though, goes against reason and all comprehension! And looking up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back—it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed in a white robe, and they were alarmed. [Mark 16:4] What the Easter Angel goes on to proclaim is the Easter Good News! A Sermon that changes the course of human history! A Sermon that touches hearts and transforms people! A Sermon when heard and believed makes it so we can't ever be the same again! We need the Sermon from this Easter Angel! The Spice Girls sure did! We come to Grace on Easter like the Spice Girls with our own doubts and fears! The past confusing! The present full of bewilderment! The future dark and dreary! What the Easter Angel has for us are three promises! One for the past! "He has risen; he is not here!" One for the present! "He is going before you to Galilee!" One for the future! "You will see Him!" These Easter promises fill us with Easter joy! They fill our past with comfort, our present with confidence, and our future with conviction! What may seem like bad news is actually the beginning of the Good News of Jesus Christ, the Son of God...for you! "Alleluia! Christ is risen! He's risen, indeed! Alleluia!"

1 Corinthians 15:1–11

adapt. from Matthew 28:7; Hebrews 2:7; Psalm 8:6

Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain.

For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. 

Mark 16:1-8

■ The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the sixteenth chapter.



When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?"
