Pastoral Care and Guests at the Lord's Supper

We are concerned about the spiritual welfare of all who partake of the Lord's Supper. If anyone eats and drinks our Lord's Body and Blood unworthily (that is, not believing what this meal is and the benefits it gives), they eat and drink to their great spiritual harm. Therefore, we kindly ask that any who are not yet instructed, are in doubt, or who hold to a belief different from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LC-MS) would not commune today.

Those who confess oneness in doctrine with us and are members of this congregation or a sister congregation of the LC-MS are welcome to commune. If you are communing, an usher will invite you from your pew to approach the rail. Pastor will then welcome you to the Lord's Table and you can either kneel or continue standing. You will be offered a cup that holds the Body of Christ. Take the cup and consume the Lord's Body. An elder will follow to pour the Lord's Blood into that same cup. If you are not communing but would like to receive a blessing, please come forward and cross your arms at the rail. If you have any questions, please speak with Pastor or an elder before the service. Thank you!

Sermon Summary

Low Sunday! That's what the Sunday after Easter has historically been called! It has to do with the drop in attendance from the High Festival of Easter Sunday! How appropriate the Gospel Reading from John 20 is all about the "Low Sunday" the disciples were having on that first Easter! Locked behind bolted doors, they were afraid the Messiah Murdering Machine was coming for them next! In the midst of their fears and doubts, Jesus pops up with His Word and Wounds! "*Peace be with you!*" And then He shows the Wounds that back up His Word! *When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord.* [John 20:20] What was for them a "Low Sunday" quickly becomes a "High Sunday"! A Sunday high on joy!

But Jesus doesn't want this Easter joy to stay in locked up in this room! He sends them to go and erase and embrace! "*Go and share the forgiveness—the erasing—of the World's Sin and while doing so embracing folks that are questioning, doubting, misunderstanding, disbelieving!*" Why? It's what the risen Lord did for them! He erased and embraced! Erased their Sin and embraced them until they believed! He sends them to join Him in His work and gives them the Holy Spirit, the Comforter, the Strengthener, to give them divine muscle power!

The disciples will need such strength with Thomas! He wasn't with the others that first Easter evening! Full of cynicism and doubt, he refuses to believe unless he can handle the evidence! The disciples don't diss or dismiss him! They embrace Thomas—holding onto him—until Jesus shows up with His Word and Wounds the following Sunday! Again, a "Low Sunday" turns into another "High Sunday"! High on joy! Thomas bursts out with that Holy-Spirit-ed confession, "*My Lord and my God!*"Let's join Jesus, too, in erasing and embracing! The Holy Spirit has been breathed into us and we're strengthened to join Him! On this "Low Sunday," let's think about those "*Thomases*" in our lives who doubt, fear, misunderstand, disbelieve, and let's embrace them, assuring them that their Sin is erased by the Lamb of God who was slain but now has begun His reign! Maybe one day they will join us in saying, "*My Lord and my God!*" Hey, our Lord does His best work on "Low Sundays"!

Epistle

1 John 1:1-2:2

That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eves, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands, concerning the word of life— the life was made manifest, and we have seen it, and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was made manifest to us- that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. And we are writing these things so that our joy may be complete.

This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.







Holy Gospel

John 20:19–31





On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of anyone, they are forgiven; if you withhold forgiveness from anyone, it is withheld."

Now Thomas, one of the Twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe."

Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.


- As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.






