Writing from the Lutheran Confessions

Because the Holy Scripture [Colossians 1:27] calls Christ a mystery, over which all heretics stumble and fall headlong, we warn all Christians that they not pry presumptuously into this mystery with their reason but simply believe with the dear apostles, shut the eyes of their reason, take their understanding captive in obedience to Christ, and take comfort and rejoice without ceasing in this, that in Christ our flesh and blood have been raised so high, to the right hand of the majesty and almighty power of God. In this way they will certainly find abiding comfort in every adversity and be preserved from harmful error. [Solid Declaration, VII:95-96]
