For genuine contrition must take place first. The Holy Spirit is given to those who, as has been said, are righteous before God (that is, have been received into grace) out of sheer grace because of the only mediator, Christ, through faith alone, apart from all works and merit. He renews them and sanctifies them, and he creates in them love toward God and the neighbor. However, because the beginnings of renewal in this life remain incomplete and sin continues to dwell in the flesh even of the reborn, therefore the righteousness of faith before God consists of the gracious reckoning of Christ's righteousness, apart from any addition of our works; it consists in the fact that our sins are forgiven and covered and are not reckoned to us (Romans 4:6-8).
