Writing from the Lutheran Confessions

You must also know how to use the name of God properly. With the words, "You are not to take the name of God in vain," God at the same time gives us to understand that we are to use his name properly, for it has been revealed and given to us precisely for our use and benefit. Therefore, since we are forbidden here to use his holy name in support of falsehood and wickedness, it follows, conversely, that we are commanded to use it in the service of truth and of all that is good-for example, when we swear properly where it is necessary and required, or also when we teach properly, or, again, when we call on God's name in time of need, or thank and praise him in time of prosperity, etc. All of this is summarized in the command in Psalm 50[:15]: "Call on me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you shall glorify me." All of this is what it means to call upon God's name to support the truth and to use it devoutly. In this way his name is hallowed, as we pray in the Lord's Prayer. [LG Catechism, I:63-64]
