So this prayer is far superior to all others that we might devise ourselves. For in that case our conscience would always be in doubt, saying, "I have prayed, but who knows whether it pleases him or whether I have hit upon the right form and mode?" Thus there is no nobler prayer (Lord's Prayer) to be found on earth, for it has the powerful testimony that God loves to hear it. This we should not trade for all the riches in the world.
