Writing from the Lutheran Confessions

Again, you are to do your neighbors no harm, injury, or violence, nor in any way to hurt them in regard to their person, spouse, property, honor, or rights (according to the order in which these things are commanded), even if you had the opportunity and occasion to do so and no one would reprove you. On the contrary, you should do good to all people, help them and promote their interests, however and wherever you can, purely out of love to God and in order to please him, in the confidence that he will repay you richly in everything. Thus you see how the First Commandment is the chief source and fountainhead that permeates all others; again, to it they all return and upon it they depend, so that end and beginning are completely linked and bound together. [Large Catechism, I:328]
